### A Compost Bin for Our School

- ① Our school should add a compost bin near the cafeteria. Each day, students throw away banana peels, apple cores, and other food scraps that could become useful soil. Compost is made when tiny living things break down plant materials over time. Instead of sending these scraps to a landfill, our school can turn them into a resource for the garden.
- ② First, composting would give our garden team material for healthier soil. When finished compost is mixed into garden beds, it adds organic matter and can help soil hold water. Fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, and crushed eggshells can be composted, but meat, dairy foods, and oily foods should stay out because they can attract pests.
- ③ Some people may worry that a compost bin would smell or create extra work. However, the school could begin with one covered bin and teach students which scraps belong inside. A clear sign with pictures would make sorting faster. Therefore, adding a compost bin is a practical first step that would reduce waste and help our garden grow.

**PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)**

Our school should place a water bottle filling station near the gym. After practice, many students wait at the one drinking fountain in the hallway. A filling station would refill bottles quickly and could reduce the number of single-use plastic bottles students buy. Some people may worry that the station would cost too much. However, the school could ask the PTO and local businesses to help pay for it. Therefore, a filling station would save time and give students an easy way to choose reusable bottles.
