Maya's Sea Otter Talk

- ① At the science fair, Maya begins her short talk about sea otters. She stands with both feet planted about shoulder-width apart and keeps her shoulders relaxed. Looking at the audience instead of the floor, she says, "Sea otters are marine mammals that spend much of their lives in the ocean." Her steady stance helps her voice sound calm. When she names her topic, she lifts one open hand toward the photo behind her. The gesture guides listeners to the image without blocking it.
- ② Next, Maya explains that sea otters often wrap themselves in kelp while resting. She holds her hands apart, then gently crosses them to show how kelp can keep an otter from drifting away. During this part, she looks first at students on the left, then at the center, and then at students on the right. Her eyes move slowly, so several listeners feel included. She does not wave her arms quickly, because hurried movements could distract from her explanation.
- ③ To end, Maya shares an opinion: protecting kelp forests matters because they provide homes and food for many ocean animals. She pauses after the word "matters" and faces the audience with her chin level. Then she points briefly to a chart showing animals that use kelp forests. Before her final sentence, she lets her arms rest at her sides. This quiet posture makes the ending feel important. Maya finishes by making eye contact with different listeners and saying, "Small choices, like reducing plastic waste, can help ocean habitats."

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

I think our school should add more refill stations for water bottles (stand with feet planted and shoulders relaxed). Refill stations could cut plastic waste (use an open-hand gesture toward an imagined bottle). They would also help students fill bottles quickly (look at listeners on the left, center, and right).

Accept answers that accurately connect Maya's nonverbal choices to their effects on listeners. For the open task, accept any clear school-related opinion with three sentences and usable notes for stance or posture, gesture, and eye movement.
