COMPOUND SENTENCE

A compound sentence joins two or more independent clauses. Each clause can stand alone as a sentence.

The gardener watered roses, and bees circled nearby.

COMPLEX SENTENCE

A complex sentence has an independent clause and a dependent clause. The dependent clause cannot stand alone.

While the painter cleaned brushes, music drifted downstairs.

- **COMPOUND:** The gate opened, and the crowd cheered.
- **COMPLEX:** After the movie ended, we discussed the ending.
