Maya Builds a Garden Poster

- ① For a school pollinator garden project, Maya needed facts about which flowers support local bees. She began with a city parks webpage and an article from a university extension office. Maya recorded each source's title, author or organization, date, and web address in her notes. She noticed that the parks page named a staff ecologist and linked to its plant list. The extension article explained how its recommendations were based on local growing conditions. These details helped Maya judge who created the information and why.
- ② Next, Maya asked an AI tool to suggest three native flowers. The tool gave a quick list, but it did not show where every claim came from. Instead of treating the list as proof, Maya compared each flower with the two sources she had saved. One suggested flower was not native to her area, so she removed it. Maya did not paste the AI wording into her report. She wrote her own summary and added a note saying that she used AI for ideas, then checked the ideas with reliable sources.
- ③ While making a poster, Maya found a bee photograph online. A search result did not tell her whether she could reuse it, so she opened the photographer's page. The page said the photo had a Creative Commons license that allowed reuse with credit. Maya placed the photographer's name, the photo title, the license, and a link in small print on her poster. She also avoided adding classmates' full names or personal contact information to the project website. Responsible researchers credit creators, follow use rules, and protect people's privacy.
