Mary Anning and the Cliffs

- ① On the rocky coast of southern England, twelve-year-old Mary Anning searched for fossils after storms. In 1811, she and her brother Joseph found a large skull in cliffs near Lyme Regis. Over many months, Mary uncovered the rest of the skeleton. It belonged to an ichthyosaur, an extinct marine reptile that looked somewhat like a giant dolphin. The discovery introduced Anning as a careful observer in a time when few scientists took girls' work seriously.
- ② Anning did not simply collect unusual objects. She studied where fossils lay in the rock layers and taught herself about their shapes. Visitors later described her carrying a hammer, basket, and notebook along the shore. In 1823, she found the first complete plesiosaur skeleton recognized by scientists. Its long neck and small head puzzled experts, and some doubted the animal was real. The detailed skeleton gave scientists evidence that ancient seas held creatures unlike living animals.
- ③ Although Anning made major finds, scientific societies did not allow women to join. Many wealthy collectors bought fossils from her family, then presented the discoveries to learned groups. Still, some scientists credited her skill. Geologist Henry De la Beche used Anning's fossil evidence when he painted a scene of prehistoric sea life. Her finds helped people understand extinction, the idea that some kinds of living things disappear forever. Today, museums display fossils like hers while historians work to name the people who found them.

The author introduces Mary Anning as a young fossil hunter who uncovered an ichthyosaur skeleton. The description of her carrying tools and finding a complete plesiosaur illustrates her careful, skilled work. The final paragraph elaborates on her importance by explaining that her fossils supported ideas about prehistoric life and extinction, even though scientific societies excluded women.

Accept different accurate details as illustrations, including Anning's study of rock layers, her tools, the plesiosaur skeleton, or De la Beche's use of her evidence. For the open response, check for all three steps of development: introduction, illustration, and elaboration supported by passage details.
