A Brighter Beach Problem

- ① On a moonlit beach in Costa Rica, sea turtle hatchlings begin a risky trip from their nests to the ocean. The newborn turtles are tiny, or very small, and their shells are fragile, meaning easily broken. They move quickly across the sand because crabs and birds may spot them. The beach looks dim at night, but lights from nearby buildings can make the shore bright. Those bright lights may pull hatchlings away from the darker sea.
- ② Wildlife workers can reduce this problem by asking residents to turn off unnecessary lamps during nesting season. A shield over a lamp sends light downward instead of outward, so less light reaches the beach. These changes help keep the shore dark and can guide hatchlings toward the water. Workers also try to keep the area quiet, or free from loud noise. A calm beach gives the small animals a safer path than a noisy, crowded beach.
- ③ Not every hatchling reaches the ocean. When a hatchling follows artificial light inland, it may become confused, or unsure about where to go. It can waste energy traveling over dry sand instead of swimming. Researchers study these journeys by watching from a distance so they do not disturb the animals. Their records show that a faint, weak glow can affect hatchlings, while a strong glow is even more likely to mislead them. Protecting dark beaches helps more turtles begin life in the sea.
