Why Some Cities Stay Hot

- ① Imagine giving a one-minute report about why cities can feel hotter than nearby rural areas. Start with one clear idea: paved surfaces and buildings absorb and hold more heat than grass and trees. This effect is called an urban heat island. During the day, sunlight warms asphalt, concrete, and rooftops. At night, these surfaces release stored heat slowly. As a result, city neighborhoods may stay warmer after sunset, especially where there is little shade or vegetation.
- ② Next, choose only details that help listeners understand the main idea. Dark pavement matters because it usually absorbs more sunlight than light-colored surfaces. Trees also matter because their shade keeps sunlight from heating the ground as much. In addition, water released by leaves can cool the air nearby. A short report does not need every fact about city weather. It needs a few connected details that explain why the heat island effect happens and why shade can reduce it.
- ③ To finish, end with a useful takeaway instead of repeating every detail. For example, a speaker might explain that planting and protecting trees can make neighborhoods more comfortable during hot weather. This ending connects the facts to an action people can understand. Notice the order of the report: name the topic, explain the cause, add supporting details, and end with the takeaway. That order helps an audience follow the information without sorting through unrelated facts or long side stories.
