Talia's Sea Report

- ① On the research boat, Talia drafted a short report about the sea at night. She wrote that some tiny organisms can produce bioluminescence, or light made by living things. The word looked long, so she did not trust her memory. In a science dictionary, she found bioluminescence listed with its meaning and spelling. She copied the spelling carefully into her report, then reread the sentence to make sure it fit her idea clearly for readers.
- ② The next morning, Talia described phytoplankton, tiny plantlike organisms that drift in water and form an important part of many ocean food webs. Because her class field guide used this word, she checked the guide's glossary instead of guessing from its sound. The glossary showed phytoplankton as one word, not two. Talia also noticed that a search result on a website shortened the word in a heading. She chose the full spelling from the field guide because it was a source her teacher had approved.
- ③ Before turning in the report, Talia checked the names of two places, the Arctic Ocean and Svalbard. She used an atlas for place names because a general dictionary might not include every location. The atlas confirmed the capital letters and the spelling of Svalbard, an island group north of mainland Europe. Finally, she used her word processor's spell-check tool to flag possible errors. Spell-check suggested a change in one sentence, but Talia compared the suggestion with her sources before accepting it. A tool can help, but a reliable reference can settle a question.
