Reporting on a Skate Park

- ① For a class podcast about a proposed skate park, Maya gathered information from the city planning page, a local newspaper article, and an interview with a parks employee. She recorded each source's title, author or organization, date, link, and the claim it supported. The planning page was an official source, but it described a proposal, not a final decision. Maya noticed that the newspaper quoted two residents with different opinions. In her notes, she separated facts, such as the meeting date, from opinions about whether the park would be noisy.
- ② Maya also used an AI chatbot to suggest search terms, including "skate park safety rules" and "youth recreation budget." She did not treat its response as evidence. Instead, she checked useful leads against sources she could identify and read. When the chatbot gave a statistic with no link, Maya left it out. She did not paste a resident's private email into the tool, because online tools may store or process what users enter. In the podcast credits, she planned to state that AI helped her brainstorm search terms, not write or verify her reporting.
- ③ Before recording, Maya asked permission to use a short quote from the newspaper and checked the article's terms for audio reuse. She chose to summarize the city document in her own words and named the document in the episode notes. For the employee interview, she confirmed how the employee wanted to be identified. Maya's final script included links to the planning page and newspaper, plus a note explaining the interview. By showing where information came from, identifying AI assistance, protecting private information, and following reuse rules, she gave listeners a way to judge her work.

1	Why did Maya avoid using the AI chatbot's statistic in her podcast?	The statistic had no link, so Maya could not identify and check its source.
2	Name two pieces of information Maya recorded for each source.	Any two: title, author or organization, date, link, or the claim the source supported.
3	Why did Maya note that the city planning page described a proposal rather than a final decision?	An official source can still describe a plan that has not been approved or finalized.
4	What are two actions Maya took to respect privacy, permission, or reuse rules?	Any two: she did not enter a private email into AI, asked permission to use a newspaper quote, checked audio reuse terms, or confirmed how the employee wanted to be identified.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

I would use the district nutrition department's menu page and a brief interview with the cafeteria manager, recording each source's title, organization or speaker, date, link or interview date, and the claim it supports. I might ask an AI tool for search terms, but I would verify every fact in the menu page or interview and would state that AI helped with brainstorming. I would link to the menu page, identify the manager only as they permit, and ask permission before using any photo or quote.

Accept equivalent answers that point to details in the passage. For Part 3, accept varied source choices if the response includes source records, verification of AI output, clear credit, and a privacy or reuse safeguard.
