PARALLEL

The parts joined or compared use the same grammatical pattern. Matching patterns make linked ideas easy to follow.

NOT PARALLEL

The joined or compared parts use different grammatical patterns, such as a verb phrase beside a noun phrase. The sentence needs revision to become parallel.

The festival offered lively music, foods from many regions, and visitors could join dances.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **MATCHED:** The scientist measured the samples, recorded the results, and repeated the trial.
- **MISMATCHED:** The scientist measured the samples, careful notes, and repeated the trial.

Challenge: Training for a marathon builds endurance, while practicing yoga develops flexibility. Marathon training demands long runs, whereas yoga requires controlled poses.

Items 1, 2, 4, and 7 are **MATCHED**. Items 3, 5, 6, and 8 are **MISMATCHED** because the linked or compared parts do not use the same grammatical form.
