HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each choice word aloud before reading the row prompt. Use the delivery named by the correct answer when you say each quoted phrase, then listen as students repeat it. Look for a voice that is easy to hear, a steady pace, and expression that fits the words.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • VOICE LEVEL

SAY "Listen to my voice. After you circle a word, can you say the same words in a clear voice?"

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: "Please listen." Did I whisper, speak clearly, or shout? Circle one word. Can you say "Please listen" in a clear voice?	clear
b	Listen: "I am here." Did I speak clearly, shout, or whisper? Circle one word. Can you say "I am here" so it is easy to hear?	whisper

PART 2 • STEADY PACE

SAY "Listen for how fast or slow I speak. After you circle a word, can you say the words at a steady pace?"

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: "We can make it." Did I say it slow, steady, or fast? Circle one word. Can you say "We can make it" at a steady pace?	fast
b	Listen: "My name is Sam." Did I say it fast, slow, or steady? Circle one word. Can you say "My name is Sam" at a steady pace?	slow

PART 3 • VOICE FEELING

SAY "Listen for the feeling in my voice. After you circle a word, can you say the words with the same feeling?"

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: "Can you help me?" Did my voice sound plain, like a question, or excited? Circle one word. Can you say "Can you help me?" like a question?	question
b	Listen: "We did it!" Did my voice sound excited, plain, or like a question? Circle one word. Can you say "We did it!" with an excited voice?	excited

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle answers are Voice Level: clear, whisper; Steady Pace: fast, slow; Voice Feeling: question, excited. Model each quoted phrase in that delivery, then accept spoken repeats that are audible, steady when requested, and use the requested question or excited expression.
