

Plant Word Hunt

Students reread simple sentences, then listen for facts in a plant read-aloud.

HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each short sentence twice, inviting students to echo-read it with you before they mark a word. Then read the plant text twice and pause for students to find words that support each answer. Students show fluency by attending to words in a sentence and show comprehension by selecting details heard in the read-aloud.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • READ AND FIND

SAY “We will read each sentence two times. First listen, then read it with me. After we read, listen to the question and circle one word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: “The sun is hot.” Which word names what is hot: sun, sat, or sip? Circle the word you hear.	sun
b	Listen: “Sam can dig.” Which word says what Sam can do: dog, dot, or dig? Circle the word you hear.	dig
c	Listen: “A bug is on a stem.” Which word tells where the bug is: step, stem, or stop? Circle the word you hear.	stem

PART 2 • PLANT FACTS

SAY “Listen to this plant book page two times: “A plant needs sun and water. Its roots take in water. Its stem holds the plant up.” Use the words from the page to answer each question.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Which word from the page tells something a plant needs: water, mud, or fog? Circle the word.	water
b	What plant part takes in water: leaf, roots, or seed? Circle the word.	roots
c	What plant part holds the plant up: leaf, root, or stem? Circle the word.	stem

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are sun, dig, and stem. Part 2 answers are water, roots, and stem; accept a clear circle around the correct word.
