HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each clue aloud and give students time to mark their page. Listen for whether students can connect each book-making role to what that person does.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Listen to each clue. I will read the three words, then circle the word that names the person in the clue.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A person puts the words in a book. Which word says reader, author, or illustrator? Circle the word that names that person.	Author
b	A person makes the pictures for a book. Which word says illustrator, reader, or author? Circle the word that names that person.	Illustrator

PART 2 • MATCH JOBS

SAY “Draw a line from each person word on the left to the action word that fits on the right. Which action goes with each person?”

- **Author** matches **Writes**
- **Illustrator** matches **Draws**
- **Reader** matches **Reads**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle Author in the first row and Illustrator in the second row. Accept lines Author to Writes, Illustrator to Draws, and Reader to Reads.
