HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Choose a classroom book with a clear printed title on its cover. Hold up the book as students listen, point to each feature, and mark the matching spoken label.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “I will hold up our book and point to one part at a time. Listen as I read the words in each row, then circle the word that names the part I show.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	I am pointing to the cover you see first when the book is closed. I read Front, Back, Title. Which word names this part? Circle it.	Front
b	I am pointing to the cover on the other side of the book. I read Title, Back, Front. Which word names this part? Circle it.	Back
c	I am pointing to the words that tell the book's name. I read Back, Front, Title. Which word names these words? Circle it.	Title

PART 2 • DRAW LINES

SAY “Look at the same book. When I show the front cover, which word should one dot connect to? When I show the back cover, which word should two dots connect to? When I show the title, which word should three dots connect to? Draw each line.”

- **1 dots** matches **Front**
- **2 dots** matches **Back**
- **3 dots** matches **Title**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle-row answers are Front, Back, Title. In the matching part, 1 dot connects to Front, 2 dots connects to Back, and 3 dots connects to Title.
