HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each clue and the printed choices aloud, then give students time to circle one word. This sheet checks whether students can choose pronouns for one person or a group, including ownership words. Before beginning, model with a different example, such as, "Omar runs. He runs," and, "Ava and Jin have a kite. Their kite flies."

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • WHO IS IT?

SAY "Listen to each clue. I will read the three words in the row, then you will circle the word that can take the place of the name or names."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Nia is reading. Which word can take the place of Nia? Read the words: she, they, he. Circle the word you choose.	she
b	Noah and Eli are hopping. Which word can take the place of Noah and Eli? Read the words: he, she, they. Circle the word you choose.	they
c	A boy named Leo is drawing. Which word can take the place of Leo? Read the words: they, he, she. Circle the word you choose.	he

PART 2 • WHO OWNS IT?

SAY "Listen for who owns each thing. I will read the three ownership words in the row, then you will circle the word that tells who owns it."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A boy named Max has a book. Which ownership word tells that the book belongs to Max? Read the words: their, his, hers. Circle the word you choose.	his
b	A girl named Zuri has a hat. Which ownership word tells that the hat belongs to Zuri? Read the words: hers, their, his. Circle the word you choose.	hers
c	Mina and Cal have a ball. Which ownership word tells that the ball belongs to Mina and Cal? Read the words: his, hers, their. Circle the word you choose.	their

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are she, they, he. Part 2 answers are his, hers, their. Accept a clear circle around the intended word, even if the circle is large or uneven.
