HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud and let students look closely at the large print. Students identify capital letters that begin spoken sentences, then write one capital letter for each sentence starter.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE CAPITALS

SAY “Listen to each sentence. Look at the words in the row, then circle the word printed correctly to start the sentence.”

a	Listen: “The kite is red.” Which word is printed correctly to start this sentence? Can you circle it?	The
b	Listen: “We can hop.” Which word is printed correctly to start this sentence? Can you circle it?	We

PART 2 • WRITE CAPITALS

Next, listen: “We can sing.” What capital letter starts We, and can you write it in the next box? Last, listen: “I am here.” What capital letter starts I when it means the person speaking, and can you write it in the last box?”
