HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read the short bee text aloud before each part, and repeat it as needed. Students listen for facts, then circle a word that answers each question. The final part asks students to identify the text's main topic and a supporting detail.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • FIND FACTS

SAY “Listen to this information text. Bees are insects. They live together in hives. Bees visit flowers to collect nectar. They use nectar to make honey. Hives help bees stay safe. Listen again when you need to.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The choices are birds, bees, and fish. Who is the text about? Circle the word that answers the question.	bees
b	The choices are leaves, water, and nectar. What do bees collect? Circle the word that answers the question.	nectar
c	The choices are hives, flowers, and nests. Where do bees live? Circle the word that answers the question.	hives

PART 2 • BIG IDEA

SAY “Listen to the bee text again. Think about what all of the facts are mostly about, and listen for one detail that supports the big idea.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The choices are nectar, honey, and bees. What is the main topic of the text? Circle the word that answers the question.	bees
b	The choices are safe, honey, and flowers. Why do hives help bees? Circle the word that answers the question.	safe

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Part 1 answers are bees, nectar, and hives. Part 2 answers are bees and safe. Accept a clear circle around the correct word, and reread the text or question as needed.
