HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each choice aloud before students mark the page. Students show that they can connect designated holidays with ways communities remember, celebrate, and recognize people or events.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Look at the three big words in each row. I will read the words, then listen to my question and circle one word.”
