**HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE**

Show students a simple labeled Virginia map and a United States map during Part 2. Read each prompt aloud, then watch students point to the named places on the maps and make the marks on their sheets. Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

**PART 1 • CIRCLE IT**

**SAY** "Listen to each question. Look at the three big words in each row, and circle one word for each question."

**PART 2 • MAP MARKS**

**SAY** "I will show a Virginia map and a United States map. On the Virginia map, point to Jamestown, Richmond, and Washington, D.C., then on the United States map point to Virginia and Washington, D.C. After you point, trace J in the first box, R in the second box, and W in the third box."

- Box 1: **J**
- Box 2: **R**
- Box 3: **W**

**WHAT TO ACCEPT**

Part 1 answers are Chesapeake, Appalachian, and Winter. In Part 2, accept J, R, and W only after the student points to Jamestown, Richmond, and Washington, D.C. on the teacher's maps.
