YOUR JOB Underline two actions that show Maya is honest or trustworthy. These actions show how people can be trusted with shared things.

Maya's Marker

- ① Maya borrowed a blue marker from the class art bin. While making a poster, she pressed too hard and the tip bent. No one saw it happen. Maya felt worried because the marker belonged to everyone.
- ② At cleanup time, Maya carried the marker to Mr. Lee. She said, "I bent the tip. I am sorry." Mr. Lee thanked Maya for telling the truth. Together, they put the marker in the supply box for fixing.
- ③ The next day, Mr. Lee asked Maya to pass out crayons. Maya counted each crayon and gave every table the right number. Her classmates knew they could count on her to care for shared supplies.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	What did Maya tell Mr. Lee, and why was that an honest choice?	Maya told Mr. Lee that she bent the marker tip. It was honest because she told the truth even though no one saw it happen.
2	What did Maya do with the crayons that showed she was trustworthy?	She counted the crayons and gave every table the right number.
3	Why could Maya's classmates count on her with shared supplies?	She told the truth about the bent marker and carefully gave each table the correct number of crayons.
