HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt and the large words aloud. Students show comprehension by choosing the vocabulary word that matches each meaning, then tracing and explaining two key words. Listen for students to connect each word to its meaning in their own simple words.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY "Listen to each question. I will read the big words in the row, then you will circle the word that answers the question."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The words are vote, rule, and leader. Which word means a direction people follow to help keep people safe and fair?	rule
b	The words are leader, vote, and rule. Which word names a person who helps guide a group?	leader
c	The words are rule, leader, and vote. Which word means telling your choice to help a group decide?	vote

PART 2 • TRACE WORDS

SAY "Which gray word says rule, and can you trace it? What does a rule help people do? Which gray word says vote, and can you trace it? What do you do when you vote?"

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle row answers are rule, leader, vote. Accept clear tracing and oral responses that explain that rules help keep people safe and fair, and voting means telling a choice to help decide.
