HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt and its choices aloud, giving students time to circle one answer in each row. The first part checks digital time and clock-hand ideas, and the second part checks days, dates, and ordinal calendar positions.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • TIME CHECK

SAY “Listen to each time question. I will read the choices in every row. Circle one answer for each question.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The choices are six o'clock, six thirty, and seven o'clock. Which digital time says six thirty?	6:30
b	The choices are hours, minutes, and days. Which word names the unit counted by a clock's long hand?	minutes
c	The choices are six, twelve, and three. At half past any hour, which number does the minute hand point to?	6

PART 2 • CALENDAR CHECK

SAY “Listen to the calendar facts and questions. I will read the choices in every row. Circle one answer for each question.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	A calendar shows Monday, May sixth. The choices are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Monday. What day is May seventh?	Tuesday
b	On a calendar, June first is Saturday. The choices are two, three, and nine. What date is the first Monday?	3
c	Today is the eighth. The choices are seventeen, eighteen, and nineteen. What date will it be in ten days?	18

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Time Check answers are 6:30, minutes, and 6. Calendar Check answers are Tuesday, 3, and 18.
