CHOOSE WISELY

Use an estimate when you need a quick, close answer. Use an exact answer when you need the real total or difference, such as for money or a final count.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A team sold 258 tickets on Friday and 141 tickets on Saturday. Does the coach need an estimate or an exact answer to report the total?

1. The coach is reporting the real number of tickets, so use an exact answer.
2. $258 + 141 = 399$.
3. The exact total is 399 tickets.

Answer: Exact answer: 399 tickets.

1. **Exact. Riley has 309 cards.** Subtract 127 from 350, then add 86. The real number of cards is needed.
2. **Estimate, about 400 students.** Round 238 to 200 and 171 to 200. A quick idea calls for an estimate.

CHALLENGE

Exact. $684 - 219 + 148 = 613$ cans. The shelter needs the real count to keep its records correct.

Accept clear justifications that connect a quick or rough need to estimating and a real count, total, or cost to an exact answer.
Accept estimates based on rounding each number to the nearest hundred.
