COMPARE PLACE VALUES

Compare the thousands first. If they match, compare the hundreds, then tens, then ones.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Order 2,405, 2,450, and 2,045 from least to greatest.

1. All three numbers have 2 thousands.
2. Compare hundreds: 0 hundreds is least. Then compare 0 tens and 5 tens.
3. Order: 2,045, 2,405, 2,450.

Answer: 2,045, 2,405, 2,450
