PLACE VALUE POWERS

Digits to the right of the decimal show tenths, hundredths, and thousandths. Each place is 10 times smaller than the place to its left. Use zero as a placeholder when a place has no value.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Write the decimal for 3 ones, 6 tenths, 4 hundredths, and 2 thousandths.

1. Write 3 in the ones place.
2. Write 6, 4, and 2 in the tenths, hundredths, and thousandths places.
3. The decimal is 3.642.

Answer: 3.642

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 4.359 meters** Put 4 in the ones place, then put 3, 5, and 9 in the tenths, hundredths, and thousandths places. The distance is 4.359 meters.
- 5; 0.005 liter** The third digit to the right of the decimal is the thousandths digit. In 0.625, the 5 represents 5 thousandths, or 0.005 liter.

CHALLENGE

No. 5.08 has 5 ones, 0 tenths, and 8 hundredths. Writing 5.080 adds 0 thousandths, so the value does not change.

Accept a leading zero in decimals less than 1, such as 0.426, and accept equivalent decimal forms with trailing zeros. For expanded form, accept equivalent forms such as $7 + \frac{3}{100} + \frac{5}{1000}$.
