Use the quotient and remainder to answer the real question.

READ THE REMAINDER

The quotient tells how many equal groups you can make. The remainder tells what is left over. If every person or item must be included, a remainder may mean you need one more group.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A supply closet has 95 pencils. Each box holds 8 pencils. How many full boxes can be packed, and how many pencils will be left?

1. Divide: $95 \div 8 = 11 \text{ R}7$.
2. The quotient, 11, tells the number of full boxes.
3. The remainder, 7, tells the number of pencils left.

Answer: 11 full boxes, 7 pencils left

A scrapbook has 13 pages, and each page holds 12 photos. A student has 157 photos. Will one scrapbook hold all the photos? Explain using the quotient and remainder.

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 10 vans** $164 \div 18 = 9 \text{ R}2$. Nine vans are full, but 2 riders still need seats, so a tenth van is needed.
- 12 tokens each, 1 token left over** $145 \div 12 = 12 \text{ R}1$. Each player gets 12 tokens, and 1 token cannot be shared equally.

CHALLENGE

No. $157 \div 12 = 13 \text{ R}1$. Thirteen pages hold 156 photos, so 1 photo will not fit and the student needs 14 pages.

Accept equivalent wording such as "6 groups with 4 left." For problems asking how many vehicles or pages are needed, accept only the rounded-up total because every person or item must be included.
