FIND THE FIRST MATCH

The least common denominator, or LCD, is the smallest number that both denominators divide into evenly. List multiples of each denominator and find the first multiple they share. That shared multiple is also the least common multiple, or LCM.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Find the LCD for $\frac{1}{6}$ and $\frac{3}{8}$.

1. List multiples of 6: 6, 12, 18, 24.
2. List multiples of 8: 8, 16, 24.
3. The first shared multiple is 24.

Answer: LCD = 24

1. **LCD = 36** Find the LCM of 12 and 18. The first shared multiple is 36.
2. **LCD = 42** Find the LCM of 14 and 21. The first shared multiple is 42.

CHALLENGE

No. The LCD is 72. Multiples of 18 are 18, 36, 54, 72, and multiples of 24 are 24, 48, 72, so 72 is the first shared multiple.

Accept answers written as a number or as "LCD =" followed by the number. Students may find the LCM by listing multiples or by using factor reasoning, as long as the denominator is the least shared multiple.
