PRIME NUMBER

A prime number is greater than 1 and has exactly two factors, 1 and itself.

13 is prime because its only factors are 1 and 13.

COMPOSITE NUMBER

A composite number is greater than 1 and has more than two factors.

21 is composite because 1×21 and 3×7 make 21.

1	12	COMPOSITE	It has factors 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 12.
2	19	PRIME	Its only factors are 1 and 19.
3	31	PRIME	Its only factors are 1 and 31.
4	27	COMPOSITE	It has factor pairs 1×27 and 3×9 .
5	43	PRIME	Its only factors are 1 and 43.
6	56	COMPOSITE	It has factor pairs such as 1×56 , 2×28 , and 4×14 .
7	71	PRIME	Its only factors are 1 and 71.
8	89	PRIME	Its only factors are 1 and 89.
