COMPARE IN ORDER

A ratio compares two quantities in the order named. Write the quantities with matching units, then simplify by dividing both parts by the same factor.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A mural uses 18 blue tiles and 12 orange tiles. Represent blue tiles to orange tiles in simplest form.

1. Write the comparison in order: 18:12.
2. Divide both parts by 6: $18 \div 6 : 12 \div 6$.
3. Record the simplified ratio: 3:2.

Answer: 3:2

- Game makers to robot builders: 4:5; game makers to all club members: 4:9.** Simplify 20:25 by dividing by 5. Then compare 20 to the total of 45 and divide both parts by 5.
- Portrait photos to landscape photos: 4:5; landscape photos to all photos: 5:9.** Simplify 20:25 by dividing by 5. Then compare 25 to the total of 45 and divide both parts by 5.

CHALLENGE

20 coders and 25 artists; coders to all students: 4:9; artists to all students: 5:9.

Accept ratios written with a colon or as a fraction when the order is correct. Because each prompt asks for simplest form, ratios should be fully reduced.
