Estimate first, then find the exact percent change.

FIND THE CHANGE

Find the difference between the original amount and the new amount. Divide the difference by the original amount, then multiply by 100 to find the percent increase or decrease. For an estimate, round to nearby friendly numbers before you calculate.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A jacket price changes from \$32 to \$40. What is the percent increase?

1. Find the change: $40 - 32 = 8$.
2. Divide by the original amount: $8 / 32 = 1/4$.
3. Convert to a percent: $1/4 = 25\%$.

Answer: 25% increase

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- Estimate: 50%. Exact: 50% increase.** The increase is 60 students. Divide 60 by the original 120 to get $\frac{1}{2}$, or 50%.
- Estimate: 30%. Exact: 30% decrease.** The price decreases by \$18. Divide 18 by the original price of 60 to get $\frac{3}{10}$, or 30%.

CHALLENGE

17% increase. The budget changes from the original \$100 to the final \$117, a gain of \$17. Divide 17 by the original \$100.

Accept reasonable benchmark estimates that are close to the exact percent. Require students to use the original amount as the denominator for each exact percent change.
