REAL NUMBER GROUPS

Natural numbers are counting numbers starting with 1. Whole numbers include 0 and the natural numbers, and integers also include negative whole numbers. Rational numbers can be written as a/b , where a and b are integers and b is not 0, while irrational numbers cannot be written that way. Every rational or irrational number is a real number.

WORKED EXAMPLE

List every subset of the real numbers that $-15/4$ belongs to.

1. $-15/4$ is a ratio of two integers with a nonzero denominator.
2. Therefore, $-15/4$ is rational.
3. Every rational number is real.
4. $-15/4$ is not an integer, so it is not whole or natural.

Answer: rational number, real number

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **integer, rational number, real number** -21 is an integer. It can be written as $-21/1$, so it is rational, and every rational number is real.
2. **rational number, real number** 2.75 is a terminating decimal, so it is rational. Every rational number is real.

CHALLENGE

False. $7/9$ is a rational number and a real number, but it is not an integer, whole number, or natural number.

Accept equivalent wording such as "counting number" for natural number. Use the convention stated in the concept box, natural numbers begin with 1, so 0 is not natural.
