HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud and give students time to look at the large day words. Students show they can identify the day before or the day after a named day by circling and drawing lines.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “I will read the words in each row. Listen for whether the question asks for yesterday or tomorrow, then circle one day. Are you ready to listen?”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	These words say Friday, Saturday, and Monday. Today is Sunday. Which day was yesterday? Which word will you circle?	Saturday
b	These words say Wednesday, Monday, and Thursday. Today is Tuesday. Which day comes after today? Which word will you circle?	Wednesday
c	These words say Tuesday, Thursday, and Monday. Today is Wednesday. Which day was yesterday? Which word will you circle?	Tuesday

PART 2 • BEFORE IT

SAY “The left column says Tuesday, Friday, and Sunday. The right column says Saturday, Monday, and Thursday. For each day on the left, which day comes just before it? Draw a line to it.”

- **Tuesday** matches **Monday**
- **Friday** matches **Thursday**
- **Sunday** matches **Saturday**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle-row answers are Saturday, Wednesday, and Tuesday. Match Tuesday to Monday, Friday to Thursday, and Sunday to Saturday.
