HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read the oral recitation prompt aloud and listen for students to say the calendar sequence. Then read each choice aloud so students can use the month order and connect one year to its quantity.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • NEXT MONTH

SAY “Can you say the months in order, starting with January? As I read each row, can you circle the month that comes next?”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	January comes first in this row. I will read the choices: February, April, June, August. Which month comes next after January?	February
b	May comes first in this row. I will read the choices: March, June, September, December. Which month comes next after May?	June
c	October comes first in this row. I will read the choices: February, May, November, July. Which month comes next after October?	November

PART 2 • ONE YEAR

SAY “How many months are in one year? Can you say the number, then trace the marks in both boxes that show your answer?”

- Box 1: **12**
- Box 2: **twelve**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle February, June, and November. Accept an oral recitation of January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, December, and the statement that one year has 12 months.
