HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read the teacher scripts aloud and model how to make one line or one circle before students begin. This sheet shows that a teen number has one group of ten and extra ones, such as 17 shown as $10+7$.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • MATCH IT

SAY “Each number on the left has one matching way to show a ten and some ones on the right. Can you draw a line from each number to its match?”

- **11** matches **$10+1$**
- **12** matches **$10+2$**
- **14** matches **$10+4$**
- **16** matches **$10+6$**

PART 2 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Each row has a teen number and three ways to show a ten and some ones. Can you circle the way that matches each teen number?”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Look at 15. Listen: ten plus five, ten plus four, ten plus six. Which one shows 15?	$10+5$
b	Look at 19. Listen: ten plus eight, ten plus nine, ten plus seven. Which one shows 19?	$10+9$

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Match 11 to $10+1$, 12 to $10+2$, 14 to $10+4$, and 16 to $10+6$. Accept circles on $10+5$ for 15 and $10+9$ for 19.
