HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read every choice aloud and give students time to mark their answers. This sheet shows that daily weather can change, but some kinds of weather happen more often during certain seasons in places with four seasons.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Listen as I read each row. Think about weather that often happens during each season in a place with four seasons, then circle one word.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The words are cold, rainy, and hot. Which weather word tells what summer often feels like? Circle it.	hot
b	The words are cold, hot, and rainy. Which weather word tells what winter often feels like? Circle it.	cold
c	The words are hot, windy, and cold. Which weather word tells what fall often feels like? Circle it.	windy

PART 2 • DRAW LINES

SAY “I will read the season words and the weather words. Draw a line from each season to the weather it often has in a place with four seasons.”

- **spring** matches **rainy**
- **summer** matches **hot**
- **winter** matches **cold**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle-row answers are hot, cold, and windy. Match spring to rainy, summer to hot, and winter to cold. These are common seasonal patterns in many places with four seasons, not rules for every day or every location.
