HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each weather clue aloud, then have students circle the matching printed weather word. Use the second part as a brief morning and afternoon weather observation, helping students connect the first letter to the weather they notice.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY "Listen to each weather clue. Point to each word as I read it, then circle the weather word that fits."

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The sky is bright, and the sun is shining. Is the weather sunny, rainy, or windy? Circle the word that fits.	SUNNY
b	Many clouds cover the sky, but no rain is falling. Is the weather rainy, windy, or cloudy? Circle the word that fits.	CLOUDY
c	The air is blowing hard, and leaves are moving. Is the weather rainy, windy, or sunny? Circle the word that fits.	WINDY

PART 2 • WEATHER NOTES

SAY "Now be a weather watcher. Look outside, or remember what you saw outside this morning. Is it sunny, cloudy, rainy, or windy, and which letter, S, C, R, or W, will you write in the AM box? Later, when you look outside again, which letter will you write in the PM box?"

- Box 1 (beside AM): **S, C, R, or W matching the morning weather observation**
- Box 2 (beside PM): **S, C, R, or W matching the afternoon weather observation**

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle-row answers are SUNNY, CLOUDY, and WINDY. For the weather notes, accept S for sunny, C for cloudy, R for rainy, or W for windy when the letter matches the class observation at that time.
